Healthy Start / Départ Santé Train-the-trainer May 9th and 10th, Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan

What is Healthy Start / Départ Santé?

Healthy Start/ Départ Santé is a bilingual health promotion initiative aimed at increasing healthy eating and physical activity opportunities in early learning environments. Healthy Start was developed in Saskatchewan with funding from the Public Health Agency of Canada. Healthy Start seeks to work with early learning centres and prekindergarten classes across the province.

Context:

An important component of our work is the Healthy Start training offered free of charge to early learning and childcare centres and prekindergarten classes. We are currently seeking individuals to become Healthy Start trainers; helping to increase our capacity and expand the initiative throughout the province. These individuals will offer trainings to interested early learning centres and Prekindergarten classes in their local communities.

Lead organization:

Based out of Saskatoon, the *Réseau Santé en français de la Saskatchewan* (RSFS), a provincial network for the promotion of health services in French, is the sponsoring organization for this initiative. The RSFS and its community partners, including the University of Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan Early Childhood Association (SECA), and many other community organizations are piloting Healthy Start in Saskatchewan and New Brunswick over the next four years.

- Provide all resources and materials needed to deliver Healthy Start trainings
- Offer ongoing support to Healthy Start trainers
- Provide an honorarium for each Healthy Start training delivered.

Trainer accountability:

- Trainers are accountable to the Healthy Start team
- Trainers will sign a Healthy Start Trainer Agreement
- Trainers are expected to offer a minimum of two to three trainings by June 2016
